

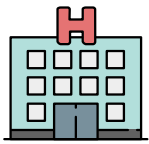
# The TEACH-PD Pilot study results

## Here is what we learned...

The research study tested a new educational package for peritoneal dialysis (PD) training called **TEACH-PD**.



The pilot study was designed to find out if TEACH-PD was acceptable to nurses and patients.

took part



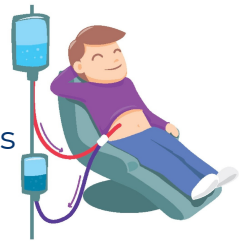
Results showed  
acceptability & usability  
of TEACH-PD

We used the feedback to improve the nurse training:

- User-friendly layout & navigation
- Applied 'Learning Styles' theory
- Simplified the wording
- Separated training into subsections



- Patients were satisfied with their training.
- No PD-related infections reported.
